


Our year is divided into four seasons, each made up of three months.

Each season is known for its weather, temperature, daylight and colour.


They are also known by how nature responds to them.

COLOURS OF FLORA IN AUTUMN



Autumn has the widest gamut of colour of all four seasons. All the colours above, as well as tints, tones and shadows derived from them, can be found in Autumn.





In some countries such as America, the season of Autumn is called 'fall'.

The following pictures highlight the season of Autumn.





SEEDPODS

A seedpod is a natural pod containing more than one seed. Different bushes and trees have different seedpods. The pod usually opens so they can distribute their seeds.

In Autumn seed pods often fall from trees.

GUMNUTS

Gumnuts are seedpods from eucalyptus trees.

In Autumn gumnuts often fall from trees.








ACORNS

Acorns are a nut from the oak tree. They have a hard dry pod that surrounds the fruit and a single seed. In Autumn acorns often fall from trees.











AUTUMN EQUINOX

As we enter the season of Autumn an astronomical phenomenon known as the Autumn equinox occurs. It happens twice a year when the night and day are around the same length. The Autumn equinox occurs around 20 march.



FUNGUS

Certain species of fungi (as well as lichen and moss) make an early appearance as summer ends and autumn leads into winter.

CHLOROPHYLL

A green pigment manufactured by trees and found in their leaves. Chlorophyll helps leaves absorb energy from light (photosynthesis). In Autumn, the chlorophyll in some leaves brakes down, causing the leaves to change colour and fall to the ground.



CHLOROPHYLL BREAKING DOWN AND REVEALING THE LEAF'S NATURAL COLOURS


























the normal separation of flowers, fruit and leaves from plants

























DAYLIGHT SAVING

Daylight saving was first mentioned by American politician/inventor Benjamin Franklin in 1784 as a way to reduce lighting costs. It was first introduced by the German Empire and Austria-Hungary on 30 April 1916. In Australia it ends during Autumn.






























WARMTH

The state, sensation, or quality of producing or having a moderate degree of heat.














SUN RISING THROUGH SMOKE HAZE CAUSED BY BURNING OFF IN LOCAL FORESTS





LOGGING COUP BURNS
