#### **PROPERTY HISTORY**

- **1997** The property at 3491 Maintongoon Road, Bonnie Doon became immortalized in Australian Film History as the holiday house of the Kerrigan Family in the classic Australian comedy movie *The Castle*. Although only a small amount of filming was done at the property, it has become an defining icon for the township of Bonnie Doon. Filming was completed in 11 days.
- 2006 Purchased by Sydney Telstra communications technician Richard Moseley after he wangled the price down from \$195.000 to \$170,000. He then listed the property as a 'Rent-a-home' for \$150/night (see attached advert in our fact sheet).
- **2010** The Castle was put on the market with an asking price of \$195,000.00.
- **2011** A Currant Affair takes up the story of the sale of the Castle in the last week of January 2011.
- 2014 An application by land owner Vicki Cosentino was made to allow for the home to be demolished so two town houses could be built in its stead. She said her tenants of seven years had caused \$14,000 in property damage.
- **2017** The old house (not property) was sold for \$40,000 by Brad Teal Real Estate and removed by the new owner. Its location is currently unknown.



The movies storyline follows the Kerrigan family's David and Goliath legal battle with the Government and an airport corporation as they battle to save their dream house from a \$70,000.00 compulsory acquisition. Whilst the Melbourne house was built on a reclaimed toxic landfill, under high tension power lines beside



the main Melbourne Airport, it was more than the Kerrigan family could ever want or dream for! To them it was a little piece of heaven on earth, which they purchased for a bargain basement price!


What makes this movie special for local Bonnie Doon residents is the movies portrayal of the Kerrigan's love for Bonnie Doon and how they would constantly drive to their Bonnie Doon holiday house for rest and relaxation. The Kerrigan's loved enjoying the spoils of the Bonnie Doon countryside, which included water sports, swimming, country living and the large high tension powerlines running beside the property!

During one movie scene the iconic muttering of "*how's the serenity*" was made in reference to the tranquillity and beauty of the Bonnie Doon lakeside district. Locals understand this all too well!

Lead actor Michael Caton was born in 1943 and has a long relationship with the Australian film industry, including *Skippy*, *Division-4*, *Homicide*, *The Sullivans*, *The Flying Doctors*, *Home and Away*, *Hey Dad*, *A country Practice*, *Blue Heelers*, *All Saints*, *Bad Cop Bad Cop* and *Packed to the Rafters*. Up until 2011 he had also played in six movies, including alongside Paul Hogan in the 2004 comedy Strange Bedfellows.

It was actor Eric Banner's first major movie role and marked the start of his highly successful acting career on the world stage.

Many commentators believe that the castle is the best Australian comedy ever made. Whether that is true of not, what is certain is that the movie has become a yard stick for other Australian comedies to measure themselves against.
