



Jack's Falls is located 7.2 km north of Molesworth on the Molesworth Dropmore Road on Reedy Creek. It is a small Waterfall with an overall drop of 5.5 m over large granite boulders.

The walk from the roadside carpark area to the Falls is 200 metres and of hard grade due to the steepness of the side of the valley. There is no established walking path, so you must make your way to the bottom of the Falls yourself.

It is 300 m downstream to Caveat Cascades and the start of the Granite Canyon (a 400 m canyon bounded on both sides by huge picturesque granite boulders and beautiful rocky ledges).

## FEATURES

- Close to Molesworth
- Natural bush setting
- Access to the bottom of the Falls
- Abundance of flora and fauna
- Water flows over massive granite boulders
- A small Cascade is located downstream
- A Granite Canyon is found below the Falls
- The Falls is photographic
- The Falls is most Impressive after rain

No camping or pets allowed.

This area is not currently managed  
as a tourism attractions.

*There is no defined track from the top of the Falls to the bottom of the Falls, so proceed at your own risk. Ensure you have bush footwear and clothing and be aware of snakes and spiders at all times. Always let someone know of your travel plans.*

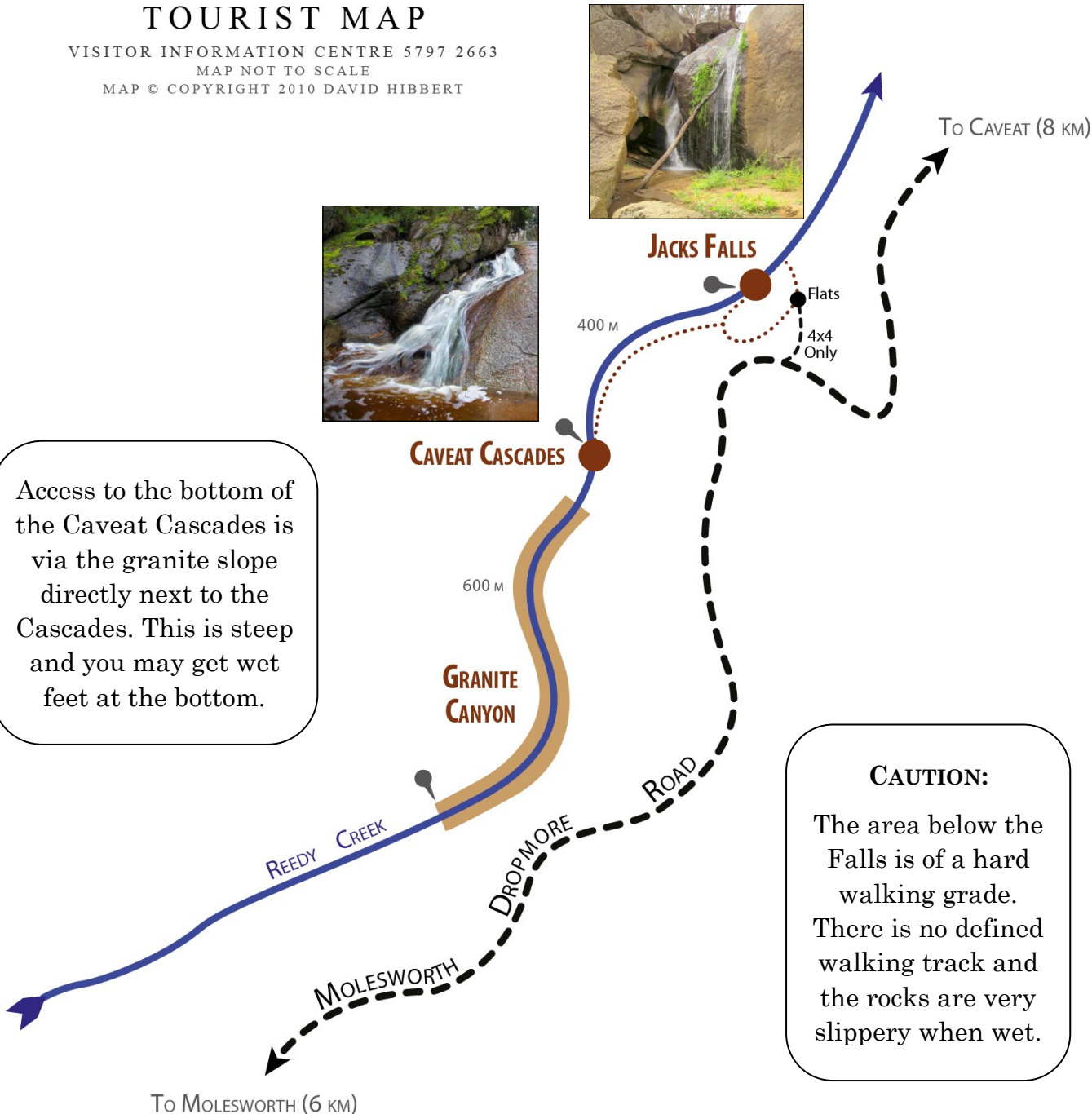
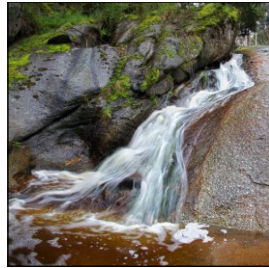

# JACKS FALLS, CAVEAT CASCADES AND THE GRANITE CANYON TOURIST MAP

Access to the bottom of the Caveat Cascades is via the granite slope directly next to the Cascades. This is steep and you may get wet feet at the bottom.

## CAUTION:

The area below the Falls is of a hard walking grade. There is no defined walking track and the rocks are very slippery when wet.



## DIRECTIONS

1. Travel to the intersection of the Goulburn Valley Highway and the Molesworth Dropmore Road at Molesworth.
2. Travel up the Molesworth Dropmore Road for 7.2 km to a small car parking area found on the left at a sweeping right bend.
3. Walk 200 m directly off the west side of the road and walk down to the creek.
4. Once at the creek, make your way upstream for 100 m to the bottom of the waterfall.

Note that the falls are best after a soaking rain, though when the area is wet, the valley walls and rocks are more slippery.
