

Wombelano Falls Kinglake Central Large Waterfalls & Cascade 45 metres 700 metres from the carpark.

Wombelano Falls is located in the Kinglake National Park. Ninety-six percent of the park was burnt during the 2009 Black Saturday Bushfires, leaving the Falls closed until 2012.



Located off Captains Creek Road, Wombelano Falls is a large waterfall located just six kilometres form Kinglake Central. The Falls is spectacular after rain, and a medium grade 750 metre loop walk (1.5 km total) to viewing platform takes you through pristine Australian Bush.


Wombelano Falls was re-opened to the public after major restoration works were completed after the Black Saturday Bushfires devastated the area.



Visiting waterfalls after rain

After showers the previous night, we decided to head to the Kinglake National Park and visit two of our favourite waterfalls; Wombelano and Masons Falls. It was a cooler day, yet perfect conditions for waterfall chasing.



Wombelano Falls was almost completely obscured by new growth, meaning visitors who take the time to visit the Falls will be disappointed and leave frustrated, like we did. This is such a spectacular Falls, but it is wanting of a little attention. If the trees cannot be trimmed, then visitors should be made aware of the Falls changed status on tourism documents, websites and via a sign at the carpark. It is also dangerous as some people may be tempted to climb over the viewing platform in order to obtain a better viewing angle.



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
