INTRODUCTION

Name: Marysville Chalet

Location: Overlooking roundabout

Commenced: c1943 Closed: c1957

Formerly: Poontawan Guest House

The Marysville Chalet was a guesthouse located where the Steavenson Hotel first stood, where Poontawan Guest House later operated and on the same block of land where the new Anglican Church and rectory stand today.



The Marysville Chalet was a Guest House located in Marysville. Its phone number was '12' and it operated from late 1936 to at least 1957. It was first under the management of Mr Harrison and could accommodate up to 90 guests.

The property was reported as being set in a picturesque garden setting and early advertising tells us that the business included a tennis court, swimming pool, billiard room, ballroom, clock golf, log fire places, free garages, buses from the city daily, as well as other guest related benefits. It was advertised as being 'convenient to snow sports' as well as having 'internal sewerage' and 'water in all rooms'.



INTRODUCTION

The property was located on the site of the former Steavenson Hotel, built circa 1865. This was the year after Marysville was first surveyed and the Marysville Land sales were held. At the time of the land sales, the property was divided into four allotments, however they were combined into one allotment by the time of the publishing of the 1866 survey map of Marysville.

The Steavenson Hotel was delicensed and closed, a new business called Poontawan Guest House was opened at the location. Poontawan was advertising as being open from July 1925 and its last advertisement appeared in *The Argus* on Saturday 11 June 1932. It does however appear that guests were still being accommodated at the Guest House some time after this, based on the social pages of *The Argus*.

The Marysville Chalet was first advertising as being open in *The Age* on Saturday 5 September 1936. Its last advertisement appears to have been in the 19 January 1957 issue of *The Argus*. The Chalet building was very large and took up the entire site of both the old Anglican Church (burnt down in 2009) and the church rectory beside the church.

Today this block remains the property of the Anglican Church. The block is located above the large roundabout (on the Marysville Woods Point Road) just near Barton's Bridge. In 2017, work on a new church on the block commenced, with it being nearly finished at the time of the factsheet being published.

Steavenson Hotel opened on site later used by Marysville Chalet.

22 July 1925

The first known advertising for the Poontawan Guest House in Marysville was published. The advertisement read:

POONTAWAN - Now open to guests, bracing winter climate, every comfort and convenience, central position. W. W. Walker, late The Bungalow.

(The Argus, 22 July 1925).

After Mr H Walker left the bungalow, it wa taken over by Sydney Elliot, who later renamed it Cumberland House. It was later renamed again to Cumberland.

6 February 1926

Newspaper advertisement for Poontawan was published in The Argus. Poontawan was located on the site formerly occupied by the Steavenson Hotel and later occupied by the Marysville Chalet. The advertisement read:

'POONTAWAN (tel. 12), now open for tourists wishing to enjoy scenic beauties of Marysville; close proximity to the famous Talbot Drive and Cumberland Valley. W. W. Walker (late The Bungalow).'

(The Argus, Saturday 6 February 1926).

The Bungalow was advertising directly under this advert as having ne management and run by Sister Cadwallader.

11 June 1932

Last advertisement for Poontawan:

'POONTAWAN-Central position, excel, cuisine, reduced tariff, Tel. 12 and Cent. 222. Bert Harrison'. (The Argus, Saturday 11 June 1932).

5 September 1936

Marysville Chalet was first advertised as being open with the same phone number as Poontawan Guest House:

THE MARYSVILLE CHALLET. Central tenia, every comfort and modern convenience; tariff from £2 2/. Phone M'ville 12. Bert






