

Stone's Outstation consists of a small historic cattlemen's hut and the ruins of a stockyard which was originally built on land owned by the Stone family. They were selectors along the Devil's River.



Long before white settlement was established in the area once known as Devil's River, Aborigines occupied the surrounding hills and river flats in large numbers. However their numbers declined sharply within the first 30 years of white settlement.

Early white settlers such as the Merlo and Stone families selected land in areas now submerged by Lake Eildon or near its bank. Stone's Outstation and Stockyards are both located on land first selected by the Stone family, just above the lake's high water line.

INTRODUCTION

Stone's Outstation is located on Station Creek, around 100 metres above the high water mark of Lake Eildon. It is located in a flat clearing 50 metres from Station Creek. Stone's stockyards are located 100 metres further west from the Outstation. The site is managed by Parks Victoria and is described below in the Lake Eildon National Park Management Plan (2009 update):

DESCRIPTION:

'Stone's Outstation and stockyards near Station Creek is a well preserved site of regional or State significance. The stone fences on Steep and Pinnacle Tracks are relatively difficult to access but are an interesting feature.'

AIM:

'Investigate the development of interpretive facilities at Stone's Outstation and Stockyards near Station Creek in conjunction with the development of an expanded day walk network in that block.'



AURLO WORKING BEE

On the weekend of 18 November 2007, a large number of volunteers of AURLO (Australian Land Rover Owners) conducted maintenance on Stone's Outstation. INTRODUCTION

Access to Stone's Outstation is via a 9.7 km walk along Wallaby Bay Walk Track. This walk commences at Wallaby Bay carpark in Coller Bay and continues out of Coller Bay, past Point Cook, into Stone Bay, past School Point and on to Aird Inlet and Station Creek. The track to Point Cook is of good grade, the track beyond Point Cook to Stone's Outstation is generally medium grade, however drops to poor grade in one area when you are required to drop down eroded banks into a creek and climb out the other side. In the wet this can be very dangerous.

Access to Stone's Outstation is possible from the water for those with boats. Camping is allowed at Mountaineer Creek Camping Area located 2 km walk to the north of the hut on the south bank of Mountaineer Inlet. Access is also available via foot from Skyline Road, down towards the lake along Station Creek Track and Aird Inlet Track. Sections of this track are steep and locked gates prohibit vehicles.

TIMELINE

Mid to late 1800s

The original Stone's Outstation was constructed by the Stone family. It is likely this hut is not the current hut.

27 February 1972

Park Ranger Ron Turner pegged the start of the walking track to connect Wallaby Bay to Cook Point. The track was then put in by relief labour. In Ron's diary it stated that by 27 May 1972 - 930 yards (900 metres) of the track had been constructed.

26 July 1972

Park Ranger Ron Turner pegged the start of the walking track to connect Cook Point to School Point.

c1990

Park employee Peter Raymond made reference to Stone's Outstation in an inter-department communication. The name Stone's Outstation was adopted from this point as the official name for the hut in department communications. Previously it had been referred to as just a hut. During our discussion he also mentioned the past existence of a hut off Blowhard Spur previously known as Sunny Slopes Hut. HE recalled that the chimney with signatures was previously stored at the Fraser Park Depot.

18 November 2007

Stone's Outstation hut was upgraded by volunteers of the AURLO (Australian Land Rover Owners) huts team in partnership with Parks Victoria, Department of Sustainability and Environment and the Victorian High Country Huts Association. See first page of log book for members and comments from the team.

1997 - 2009

The Parks Victoria Lake Eildon National Park Management Plan (1997 and 2009) describes the site and site aim:

DESCRIPTION: 'Stone's outstation and stockyards near Station Creek is a well preserved site of regional or State significance. The stone fences on Steep and Pinnacle Tracks

are relatively difficult to access but are an interesting feature'.

AIM: 'Investigate the development of interpretive facilities at Stone's Outstation and stockyards near Station Creek in conjunction with the development of an expanded day walk network in that block'.

15 January 2011

An unknown team of volunteers did basic work on the hut in association with the <u>Victorian High Country Huts</u> Association.

22 April 2015

Artworkz photoshoot. Access was by boat - thanks to Ian Faulks.

23 April 2015

Artworkz commenced work on this factsheet.

29 April 2015

A geocache went live at the site - making history as the first geocache ever located at the historic outstation.

9 November 2016

Mud Map from Peter Raymond added.

2016

Initial planning for the restoration of the hut was conducted by Parks Victoria in conjunction with the Victorian High Country Huts Association and the Idlers 4WD Club of Victoria.

13-19 March 2017

Stones Outstation was restored by Parks Victoria in conjunction with the Victorian High Country Huts Association and eight volunteers from the Idlers 4WD Club of Victoria.

14 May 2017

Artworkz Photoshoot. Access was via boat - thanks to Colin and Sarah Anderson.




STONE'S HUT (OUTSTATION)

LAKE EILDON NATIONAL PARK, MAY 2015









STONES BAY - LAKE EILDON NATIONAL PARK - 14 MAY 2017



Stones Outstation has recently been upgraded, so we wanted to travel to the site and photograph the hut and repairs. Parks Victoria in conjunction with the <u>Idlers 4WD Club of Victoria</u> and the Victorian High Country Huts Association (VHCHA) completed the upgrade in March 2017.





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

The walk to Stones Outstation started at Wallaby Bay in Coller Bay and was 9 km each way. The idea of me doing an 18 km walk took some planning and fitness preparation. After a month and a half of fitness walking, I attempted the walk.



The day was mild, cloudy and the forecasted top temperature was a lovely 28 degrees. It was a perfect time to attempt the walk. The hike is not hard, with the track in mostly good condition and bridges of good quality. However there is one creek crossing where there is no department bridge and it requires a descent into the creek and over some makeshift logs. In summer this is achievable, though in winter you have to be very careful with slippery banks and wet logs.


The hut is gorgeous and always very photographic. While there a visitor came in by Jet Ski after being told about the hut by a friend. He was staying on one of the nearby houseboats and really enjoyed seeing the old relic and learning a little of the history of the hut and the Stone family.

If you are intending to attempt this walk, make sure you take plenty of water, maybe some hiking food and appropriate footwear, clothing and hat.


Stone's Outstation consists of a small historic cattlemen's hut and the ruins of a stockyard which was originally built on land owned by the Stone family who were early selectors along the Devil's River. Stone's stockyards is located 250 metres west of Stone's Outstation near Station Creek Track, though has now deteriorated to the point where it is not that visible. They measured 20 m by 8 m and was built with old post and rail fencing.


